## UNIFORMS FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL MUSIC GROUPS

One of the principles to which we must be committed is to keep the expense to students participating in special music activities to a minimum.

- I. Band Uniforms: These uniforms may consist of a uniform color of shoe, a washable pair of slacks, and a necktie to be purchased by the student. In designating and selecting these items, costs should be kept at a minimum. Schools should feel free to purchase suitable insignia and any necessary ribbon for putting stripes on trousers from funds raised for this purpose. (Tax monies should not be used.)
- II. Chorus Groups: The uniform for this group should consist of shirt or blouse, skirt or slacks, shoes, and an identifying scarf or tie. Students may be expected to furnish this complete uniform, or the school may purchase any or all of this outfit, except the shoes, depending upon the money which is available.
- III. Schools Presently Equipped with Band Uniforms and Choral Robes:
  - A. In interschool activities, all schools are expected to conform to the above criteria.
  - B. In the middle schools where existing uniforms do not comply with the above standards, it is agreed that replacements of the uniforms should follow the criteria outlined in I. and II. above.
