

Web access widens for students, parents
Miami-Dade County Public Schools will roll out a new version of its Web portal that will give unprecedented online access to parents, students and teachers.

Now, Miami-Dade County Public Schools will give parents and students even more access to school data online. Check out school test results, check grades and report card information — all in one place.

The school district will unveil a new version of its Web portal Monday, an interactive online site that will give the school district's 53,000 employees and 342,000 students and their parents unprecedented online access to everything from testbooks to learning information. The site will be only in English at first. District officials say that preparing the site will cost about \$3.2 million, including salaries for staff who will be working on it for several years.

"I love it," said parent Tania Rodriguez, who attended a recent training session to learn how to use the site. "I wish they would have done this ages ago. It saves us a lot of time and money."

School districts around the country are watching Miami-Dade's experiment with an eye toward getting more parents involved in their children's education.
